
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MERGE Recent Exhibition May 2019 Main Street Gallery, Ketchikan, Alaska


The first exhibit supported the Xerces Society which has extensive programs to improve butterfly habitat.

Ofquisite

This series is loosely inspired by the parlor game Exquisite Corpse. This pastime was first played by the Surrealists in the early 1900's as a word game and evolved into a drawing game. A player would draw a head, pass the paper to the next artist to draw the torso, and then the lower extremeties. The backgrounds in this series evoke the horizontal foldings of the paper as it is passed around.

Each dancer is individually framed, $14 \times 30 \times 2$ inches





Meant to be hung as pairs of dancers, they are likely capable of freestyle dancing too.

I typically add something with a facial structure for at least one of the pair.

Shadows are cast by the linocuts which are mounted at varying heights.

Each Giant is individually framed, 16 x 30 x 2 inches








Octopoda Series

> Mounted with chart pins Currently unframed




Octopoda Series


